During the collegewide [Zoom session](#) on June 10, I shared that our fall 2021 enrollment headcount is up 2% compared to last year and that, on average, students are signing up for around 5.8 credit hours. I encourage advisors and all HACC employees to challenge our students to sign up for one more class if possible.
